Early Years Foundation Stage

We provide a play based environment which focus's on children learning through play and allows children to use role play and imagination, our construction toys and craft activities will help children with their fine motor skills whilst playing football, going on the trim trail etc. will develop them physically.

We provide freely chosen self-directed play for all children. Most of these activities are initiated by the child rather than led by staff. However we do have an adult initiated craft table which has different art and craft activities for the children to join in with everyday and is adapted according to the children's needs and wishes.

Staff

All staff are fully trained for working in an After School Facility.

Pledge to Children

We believe you have a right to expect that your best interests are a priority when decisions are being made about you. We will therefore:

Breakfast Club (8.00am to 8.45am)

The children will be provided with a balance and nutritious breakfast. Food on offer will be include: a choice of breakfast cereal or fromage frais, toast with honey, jam, marmalade or marmite; Banana, apples or raisins, water or milk. The Infant School children will be escorted to their classroom and a member of staff will and them over to their class teacher. The Junior School children will be released to walk to their classrooms once the doors have been opened.

After School Club

(3.15pm to 5.55pm)

The children have access to fresh water and fruit at all times as well as milk on request. A snack (not a replacement for their evening meal) is provided mid-session such as bagels, muffins, crumpets etc. with jam, honey or marmite. A selection of activities are available for the children to take part in such as puzzles, art and crafts, computing, trim trail, physical activities etc. The children are free to choose what activities they would like to take part in.
